Tips and Tricks for Quilters

I learned a great tip from Nancy Halpern at her Monet's puzzle workshop. Instead of using plastic to cut out templates, use a Chinet paper plate. This brand of paper plate has just enough "grab" to it on the back so that the template pieces won't slide around on the fabric.

Quilt designer Mark Lipinsky suggests that to keep your rotary cutter sharp, mark the date of the blade change with masking tape on the flat part of the cutter. When your rotary cutter starts skipping, take it apart and turn the blade, add a drop of sewing machine oil and you get double the life on your blades.

Another suggestion from Mark is, to avoid hunching your shoulders when sewing, prop your sewing machine forward with inexpensive rubber doorstops. Now this one is one I will certainly try, because I am constantly getting neck pain from hunching over my sewing machine.


Never blow into your bobbin case as moisture can damage it. I am so guilty of this! A feather, chenille pipe cleaner, child's paintbrush or canned air is usually more effective than the small brushes that come with the sewing machine. So the next time you walk on the beach, pick up a feather as a new tool for quilting.




Take Route 95 South to exit 10 A, Route 177 East. Drive down Route 117 for 1.4 miles.


Directions from the South:


After the meeting is over, you will exit the parking lot through another One Way street that is closer to St. Barnabas – between the church & the Town Hall.
