Redwork by Barbara Hartford, yo-yo's and fabric piecing will be presented. A great chance for NBQA to tell our story!



Many thanks to those that attended the Quilt-A-Thon on March 30th. It was the best attended Quilt-A-Thon with both new and old faces and a lot was accomplished! A great big appreciative hug to all of you! Our next Quilt-A-Thon is planned for Saturday, May 18th from 9 am – 3 pm at the Classroom, 74 Nooseneck Hill Road, West Greenwich, RI 02817. It is right off Rt 95 at Exit 6.

We haven't had a chance to deliver any quilts this past month; however, we have 19 quilts that will be delivered in the coming month along with the quilts that are returned at the April and May meetings. Kits are available to be worked on at our meetings. Any stage of a quilt can be done (piecing a top, making a quilt sandwich, quilting, binding, putting a label on, etc.). Some like to do just one step of the process, some like to do it all. Whatever help you are able to give is greatly appreciated. Since September we have donated quilts to the following:

By car:

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstates 93 and 495 and Route 3. From Route 3 take exit 30B northbound or exit 30A southbound onto I-495 towards. Lawrence, From I-495 take exit 35C onto the Lowell Connector. Continue about 2 miles to Exit 5B onto Thorndike St.

At the 4th light, Thorndike Street merges into Dutton Street. Go to the 2nd light and turn right onto Market Street.
