Have you always admired those pieced circles? You can do it with ease and without even pinning. Create a small (32 x 32) unique quilt of your very own while learning to piece circles & some unusual strip sets, and do Carol's trademark circular quilting to complete the look. You'll also learn how to finish your quilts with facings instead of bindings.

Carol will teach 12-15 quilting design patterns for you to try and go over many of the techniques in the various books teaching free motion quilting. This is a hands-on class to learn and practice these fast new ways of quilting and embellishing your quilts by machine. Learn to do decorative stitching with those metallic and rayon threads! Machines need only have a straight stitch to do these designs. And even the students who've had very little quilting experience are successful using these methods.

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## **Meet the Workshop Presenters**

#### **Judith Larzelere**

I am interested in color interaction and creating a sense of movement and mood in my works. I tend to like vivid, active color but have used all palettes for commissions to suit the client's needs. All my quilts are made with a sewing machine. I use hand dyed fabrics purchased from various sources. My technique is based on strip piecing and my quilts are strip quilted. I design and produce all the quilts myself.

#### **Carol Taylor**

I love color! Since receiving my first box of crayons, I've been in love with color. It's the reason I chose to pursue a degree in elementary education back when we were expected to teach art, music, and physical education. Color is partly responsible for my love of decorating and choosing clothes. It is why I've always been involved in some kind of art. But not until I began quilting in 1993, did I truly find the most joyous way of using color, texture, and design together.

I enjoy the challenge and spontaneity of creating a design with fabrics, using all their glorious hues and textures; never knowing quite how it will turn out. I inevitably learn something during the design process and sometimes the results surprise even me. It's part of the fun!

My quilts are contemporary in style and often abstract in design, emphasizing color, contrast, and value relationships. I piece by machine and free-motion machine quilt them extensively, adding another layer of color and design to each quilt.

I am obsessed with quilting! I love spending time in my studio "playing" with fabrics, threads, and designs. The colors and textures inspire my creative energies and make me happy. There is nothing I would rather do! Quilting is my true passion and joy!



Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstate 93 and 495 and Route 3. Take the Lowell Connector from either Interstate 495 (Exit 35C) or Route 3 (Exit 30N Northbound or 30A Southbound) to Thorndike Street (exit 5B). Go the 6th light and turn right onto Market Street.

Park at street meters, the Leo A. Roy Market Street Garage, or on weekends ONLY, the lot behind the museum on Middle Street.

To drive up to the door, go into the next light into Palmer Street. Go to the next light and turn left onto Merrimack Street. Go to the next corner and turn left onto Shattuck.



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
