You can incorporate them by block choices, appliqué, quilting, embellishment, fabric choice, or any other way you choose. Please include a label on the back telling how many of the items you have showcased in your quilt (you do not need to list the items). Minimum size is 10 in x 10 in. There is no maximum size.

Article of clothing or element from an article of clothing (zipper, button, etc.), Bow, Bird, Butterfly, Cat, Dog, Dragonfly, Fish, Flower or plant, Fruit, Leaf, Tree, Your first initial, The number 1976 (the year the guild was founded), Circle, Diamond, Heart, Moon, Star, Sewing notion or tool, Spoon or fork, Basket, Nine patch block, Sea shell, Anchor, Automobile, Lizard, Boat, Cell phone, Beverage

Members will vote at the September meeting and prizes will be awarded for the most creative presentation of the items. An additional prize will be awarded to the quilt that incorporated the most items from the list.


