# Narragansett Bay Quilter's Association GENERAL MEETING Minutes May 17, 2012

**President:** Melanie Johnston called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM, following an early strawberry social.

Joan Halley presented a check for \$2000 from the basket raffle to Erik Wallin of Operation Stand Down RI, in support of the Holly Charette House for women veterans.

**Comfort Quilts:** Donna Woodworth recognized and thanked all the volunteers, then presented a total of 65 quilts to the following organizations: Friend's Way, Holly Charette House, VNA-Care RI, Women and Infants Hospital, Ronald McDonald House, the Wood River Clinic, and the Northern RI Visitation Center.

Sandra Munsey is selling Redwork e-books for \$9.99, and Quilt Challenge kits to benefit the Libby Museum in Wolfeboro, NH (\$15).

Carol Taylor presented a lecture called Sew Many Quilts, So Little Time, and she wasn't kidding. She followed that with a trunk show of her beautiful work, all produced on a Bernina 1630. Her workshop CD was purchased for the NBQA library.

**Treasurer:** Cheryl Martin reported a general fund balance of \$12162, and a quilt show account balance of \$14090.

**Membership:** Sue Ellis reminded everyone to renew their membership before June 1 or they would go to the bottom of the waiting list, which is currently 34 people.

**Special Events:** Louise Pankiewicz said to watch for a trip in November.

**Quilt Show:** Joan Halley thanked everyone for their help with the quilt show, including Celia Schnacky, Betty Pashkovsky, Karen Stanley, Margaret White, and several husbands, etc., who helped with setup and takedown. Yellow viewer comments are available in the lobby and show pins are still for sale. All receipts must be turned in ASAP. The profit for the show is between \$5000 – \$6000.

**NEQM:** Sue Stedman announced that \$2280 was raised in the mini-auction, a record amount, and it would be divided into 3 donations to the museum: \$1030 as a supporting guild (see Sue for free passes); \$250 for a sail boat block on the 25th anniversary signature quilt, and \$1000 toward a matching grant. The museum is open for free admission on the 25th of every month during this anniversary year.

**Program:** Steffanie Windus announced the first two workshops for the fall: Sharon Mayers' Poppers on a September Saturday, and Jackie Kunkel paper piecing in October.

**Vice President:** Billie Bunnewith thanked Melanie for her wonderful service as President and presented her with a gift of fabric from the board. She announced the summer challenge of a scavenger hunt, in which up to 30 different items must be incorporated into a quilt using any technique. Please put the total of items on the label on the back. There will be prizes at the September meeting.

Sharon Mayers sold the most raffle tickets and won a free membership. The winner of the raffle quilt was Susan Blade.

President: Melanie announced that the NBQA is forming a limited liability corporation, and seeking 501(c) (7) tax exempt status, based on a requirement from the bank. The fee for the LLC is \$200, and there will be an annual fee of \$50 paid to the state, and a short IRS form to fill out.

At **Joanne's** if you show them your membership card they will let you apply for their 10% off discount card.



You can incorporate them by block choices, appliqué, quilting, embellishment, fabric choice, or any other way you choose. Please include a label on the back telling how many of the items you have showcased in your quilt (you do not need to list the items). Minimum size is 10 in x 10 in. There is no maximum size.

Article of clothing or element from an article of clothing (zipper, button, etc.), Bow, Bird, Butterfly, Cat, Dog, Dragonfly, Fish, Flower or plant, Fruit, Leaf, Tree, Your first initial, The number 1976 (the year the guild was founded), Circle, Diamond, Heart, Moon, Star, Sewing notion or tool, Spoon or fork, Basket, Nine patch block, Sea shell, Anchor, Automobile, Lizard, Boat, Cell phone, Beverage

Bring your finished piece to the September meeting where they will all be hung on display. Members will vote at the September meeting and prizes will be awarded for the most creative presentation of the items. An additional prize will be awarded to the quilt that incorporated the most items from the list.




# From the Hospitality Committee

# NBQA Block of the Month 2012-2013

This year we are going to try something a little different with Block of the Month. Instead of entering your blocks into a winner-take-all drawing, you will keep your blocks and enter for a fabric drawing (one entry per person, and you must present your blocks to enter). The finished quilts will be a special exhibit in the 2014 Quilt Show. The schedule for which blocks to bring each month is given below (make 2 of each).

Go to the free patterns section of <u>debbiemumm.com</u> and download a copy of the pattern, which is her 2010 Block of the Month Project (www.debbiemumm.com/Projects/QuiltBlocks/2010). Print the pattern in black and white if you can. I have a few copies of the pattern for those without internet access, which can be obtained at the BOM table while supplies last.

The fabric requirements page of the pattern lists several fabric colors, but ignore the specific colors and choose your own. However, it is necessary to keep the colors dark or light as indicated on the original pattern. Choose 17 fabrics that you like together. You will need some fabrics for the borders as well as the blocks.

The quilt has 4 different star blocks and 1 center block. The 4 blocks are made with 1 light on dark and 1 dark on light. The blocks finish to 12 ½ inches according to the pattern or you can reduce or enlarge the block size if you wish.

There are 7 borders. The first border is pieced and completes the design of the quilt top. You can eliminate some of the borders if you don't want to add all of them.

#### **Schedule:**

October: Boxed Star March: Center Block

November: Octagonal Star April: Sashing Squares (sewn onto blocks or separate)
January: Double Star May: Pieced Quilt Top (with or without all borders)

February: Pinwheel Star


# **Comfort Quilts**


In September, we have our own NBQA member, Sharon Mayers, with her "Piecing with Poppers" workshop. This will be held at the church on Saturday, Sept 22 so there will still be time to sign up for it at the September meeting. Sharon will teach her new and easy method for adding strips between the blocks of a table runner to really make the fabrics "pop"! Cost of this workshop is \$35.

**In October**, we have Jackie Kunkel coming from CV Quiltworks in Canton, CT. She will be teaching paper piecing with Judy Niedmeyer's patterns. These patterns are fabulous with their arcs of sharp points and fabric combinations. If you are ready to try paper piecing, this class is for you! Jackie has asked that you select one of three patterns, you can purchase it and any materials you need from her website. See our <u>nbquilts.org</u> website for details and a discount code she has given us to use. Cost of this workshop is \$40.

You can see our website for a full list of speakers and workshops scheduled for this year. Also general class information and supply lists for all classes. All classes will be held at the church, most are on the Thursday of the meeting, but there are two on Saturdays and one on a Friday. Please plan to arrive for class at 9:00 with your sewing machine and all materials prepared for the class, irons are provided. You will have a half hour to setup for a 9:30 start. Classes end at 3:30 with another half hour to clean up and be out by 4:00. There will be coffee provided and a 45 minute lunch break, it is helpful If you bring a lunch. If you are staying for the meeting, you may want to join us as we take the instructor out for dinner. This is a nice way to relax and visit with her and other NBQA members.

There are also opportunities for hosting at the workshops. The Host helps the instructor with setup and cleanup and as an aid during the class. The Host gets to see the techniques being taught without paying for the class or actually taking it. You may also be asked to help with vending during the meeting.

At the New Members meeting in August, several people asked about beginner quilting classes. If you are interested in such a class, let me know and we will see about putting one together.

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstate 93 and 495 and Route 3. Take the Lowell Connector from either Interstate 495 (Exit 35C) or Route 3 (Exit 30N Northbound or 30A Southbound) to Thorndike Street (exit 5B). Go the 6th light and turn right onto Market Street.

Park at street meters, the Leo A. Roy Market Street Garage, or on weekends ONLY, the lot behind the museum on Middle Street.

To drive up to the door, go into the next light into Palmer Street. Go to the next light and turn left onto Merrimack Street. Go to the next corner and turn left onto Shattuck.
