WE ARE STILL ON! 2022 FABRIC CHALLENGE

NBQA members and associate members are eligible to participate.

The entries will be presented and voted on at the February zoom meeting. It will be handled the same as the summer challenge with each member having one vote for their favorite. Photos should be emailed to Geri Bergreen to be included in a power point presentation. The deadline has been moved forward to allow her time to do this. *Thanks for your understanding!*

There is still fabric to purchase if needed. Contact Louise or Diane.

Two challenge fabrics were chosen.

Both fabrics must be used and recognizable on the front of the quilt. They must be used within the design, not just as border, sashing, or binding.

All items submitted must have three layers (top, batting, back) held together by stitching. A qualifying item may be a quilt, clothing, purse, tote, or other accessory.

The size must be at least 10° x 10° (or a total of 40° for all four sides) but not more than 24° x 36° (or a total of 120° for all four sides).


PROGRAMS

The **January 15, 2022** workshop with Pat Harrison, <u>Binding 101 - Basic</u> Bindings, has been **postponed**. New date is to be determined.

January 20, 2022 "Batting: What's Inside Matters" - Stephanie Hackney/Director of Sales and Marketing, Hobbs Bonded Fibers. There will also be an opportunity for someone to win batting. This lecture will be offered via Zoom.

February 17th, 2022 – "Flora & Fauna: The Embroidered Bed Rugs and Quilted Petticoats of New London County, 1750-1810" – Lynne Bassett lecture. New London County has an extraordinary needlework heritage that will be explored in an exhibition at the Florence Griswold Museum in Old Lyme, CT., for which Bassett is the guest curator. (The exhibition will be on view from February 12 to May 1, 2022.) This lecture will focus on two groups of objects---distinctive quilted petticoats from the mid-18th century and embroidered wool bed rugs---to explore design inspirations, technique, and family connections. This lecture will be offered via Zoom.

February 19th, 2022 – "Diamonds can be a girl's best friend" - Saturday from 9:30-to 2:30 in person workshop with certified Eleanor Burns instructor, Louise Pankiewicz. After taking this workshop you will have a better understanding of how to cut and piece 60 degree diamonds and 120 degree setting triangles. Students will work with their stash or instructor provided kits and the Creative Grids 60 Degree (CGR60DIA) Diamond ruler to create the "Diamond Party Quilt" from the Quilt in a Day company. Louise is working on two different color versions and will send pictures out when they are done.

Activity Mats are the size of a placemat and include pockets, zippers, buttons, strings of beads, bells, etc. They may also include a textured pocket with a soft toy or vinyl pocket for photos. Making activity mats is a great volunteer opportunity and gift from the heart.

The activity mats are designed to safely stimulate and soothe people with Alzheimer's and other cognitive challenges, while providing a better quality of **LIFE**.....

- L Lift spirits and entertain users while relieving caregivers.
- I − Interest users in items on the mat. This stimulates senses and reinforces memory.
- **F** Focus user's attention during therapy or conversation with a caregiver. Helps visitors and staff find topics of conversation with users.
- **E** Exercise hands and fingers.

So, I hope you will join me in this challenge. I appreciate your support in this worthwhile cause. And can not wait to see what you all will be making.

NEW LONDON COUNTY QUILTS & BED COVERS, 1750–1825 February 12–May 1, 2022

The domestic textiles produced in New London County from the mid-18th to early 19th-century stand out today as masterpieces of American needle craft. Curated by independent scholar Lynne Z. Bassett, New London County Quilts & Bed Covers 1750-1825 examines the artistic excellence of these pieces within the context of design inspiration drawn from an array of transatlantic sources and explores the question of how the county fostered such exceptional work. Quilted petticoats with maritime motifs, bold geometric patterns on bed rugs, sophisticated feathers and fruit stitched on elegant whitework quilts, and patriotic appliqués reveal the range and accomplishment of New London County women. The exhibition unites for the first time

examples by these makers, whose names are only sometimes known, but whose textiles survive as evidence of the network of connections between teachers, students, and family members.

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstates 93 and 495 and Route 3. From Route 3 take exit 30B northbound or exit 30A southbound onto I-495 towards. Lawrence, From I-495 take exit 35C onto the Lowell Connector. Continue about 2 miles to Exit 5B onto Thomdike St.

At the 4th light, Thorndike Street merges into Dutton Street. Go to the 2nd light and turn right onto Market Street.
