NBQA General Membership Meeting 02-16-23 Zoom

The January meeting of the Narragansett Bay Quilters Association was called to order at 6:31pm by President Gail Macera.

Carol Ann Robertson introduced our guest speaker for the evening, Pam Weeks. Pam's interest in quilting began in 1976 during the Bicentennial and in 1991 she began to focus on antique quilts and textiles, primarily signature and potholder quilts. Pam is the Binney Family Curator at the New England Quilt Museum and has authored several books including "Civil War Quilts", "Deeds Not Words", and "Portable Patchwork". Pam's lecture tonight was called "What's New About Jane Stickle?" which focused on the life of the woman who designed and made the original "Dear Jane" quilt in 1863. Jane's niece Sarah donated the quilt to the Bennington Museum in Vermont and this quilt has been admired, studied, and copied for many years. There are 169 two color blocks (5,602 pieces, some as small as a quarter inch), each block is a different pattern, and no fabric is repeated in the quilt. Our own Lisa Bagian took one year to make a "Dear Jane" quilt which won a merit award at the 2022 NBQA quilt show. We also saw our own Brenda Devine's stunning "Dear Jane" quilt as well.

These hearts help with the bonding process and provide comfort for the newborns. Directions will be provided on the website, newsletter, Facebook, and email. Kits can be picked up at Island Creations by Louise and Blaine's Sewing Center. It is important to sew these hearts with clean hands that have no lotion or scented soaps or perfumes on them. The hearts can be turned into Joan at the March meeting. Special thanks to Barbara LaPlume for making 84 scent hearts!

Joan still needs more maple leaf blocks for the 2025 raffle quilt. Instructions have been published in the January/February newsletter. Please use a color wheel to select complementary colors for the blocks (opposite sides of the color wheel) and to use different fabrics so there will be a variety of blocks in the guilt (preferably no beige or white). Please mail your blocks to Joan Potter or give them to her at the March meeting.

The 2023 Summer Challenge will coordinate with the Comfort Quilt committee again this year. The finished quilts will be donated to DCYF for children in foster care (from birth to age 18). There will be fabric kits available for pick up at the May meeting. Quilts can be crib size (40x52) or twin size (68x93). A coordinating pillowcase would be appreciated.
