# NBQA General Membership Meeting 09-21-23

### **President Gail Macera:**

The September meeting of the Narragansett Bay Quilters Association was called to order at 6:40 pm by President Gail Macera.

Before the business meeting, members could shop our boutique at greatly reduced prices. Gail said that the boutique will be held in October as well (for as long as our inventory holds). The completed summer challenge quilts were collected and displayed on the pew backs for members to vote for their favorite.

Gail introduced tonight's speaker, Jane Ahles. Jane is a DCYF Licensing Supervisor and has worked at DCYF for 27 years. In 2004 she took over the role of holiday donations chairperson and found that the children as well as the staff were brought joy by the generosity of the community. Last spring's quilt donations from NBQA were given to "vet" kids (age 18 - 22) who were aging out of the system's group and foster homes. The recipients were touched that someone made a quilt just for them. Jane said that she and the staff at DCYF are very appreciative of our beautiful quilts!

Gail also received a thank you from the Hope Alzheimer's Center for 2 quilts donated for their silent auction fundraiser to be held on Saturday at their "Soiree Under the Stars". The quilts were made by Linda Maslanka. Gail also donated a quilt that she made. Gail will attend the benefit with Barbara Hartford.

Gail asked our new members present tonight to stand and introduce themselves. The new members were invited to a Sit and Sew this Saturday.

The completed quilts were folded and put into their coordinating pillowcases and given to Jane Ahles for distribution at DCYF.

The 2025 raffle quilt "Colors in the Wind" was on display at the meeting. Joan handed out raffle tickets to the members present. If all the tickets are sold, the guild will make \$2000. Many thanks to Joan for collecting the blocks from members and assembling them into this beautiful quilt! Thanks also go to Blaire Gagnon for her beautiful long arm quilting!

Our next quilt show will be held on April 27 and 28, 2024 at the West Warwick Civic Center. There is lots of space so members are encouraged to submit as many quilts as they want. Quilts that were in our last show in October 2022 can be submitted as long as they were not judged. The quilt show application will be in the November newsletter and on the website. The deadline for submission is at the February 15, 2024 meeting or by mail to Diane Roberts (her address will be on the application). Judging is optional. For those who would like their quilt to be judged, there will be a \$10 fee for the 1st quilt and \$5 fee for any additional quilts. Judging will take place on March 16, 2024 at the Exeter library. Details about drop off and pick up will be announced. The judging will be done by the "elimination" method by a judge from New Jersey. Ribbons will be awarded only to judged quilts. There will be 2 categories for judging (Master and Artisan). The Master category includes quilters with a high level of proficiency, teach quilting, etc. The Artisan category will include everyone else.

The Education Committee is looking for volunteers to do a demo at the quilt show. Please contact Peggy Lane if you are interested in helping out.

Donations of small wall hangings and table runners are needed for the quilt show silent auction. Please see Karen Stanley or Joan Potter.

Donations for the basket raffle of completed baskets or items for baskets or just baskets can be given to Geri Bergreen starting in February. Items do not have to be quilt related.

Pat Pepin volunteered to chair the Mug Mat (handmade coaster) Committee.

Barbara Stetson will ask members to distribute posters to the community to advertise our quilt show when the posters have been printed.

Joan is looking for a volunteer to chair the take down committee for the quilt show. Joan will bring a sign-up sheet for the various jobs at the quilt show to the October meeting.

Set up for the quilt show will be on Friday, April 26, 2024. Admission will be \$10 (only pay once if you attend both days).
