Have you inherited or collected fabrics, linens, doilies, trims, blocks etc. that would today be considered vintage (20 years or older), and just left them languishing in a drawer or your stash wondering what to do with them? Is it because you think of them as old-fashioned?

In this workshop, Blaire Gagnon will help you explore how one can acquire, prepare, and use vintage and antique textiles in new and unique ways that expand our definitions of the possible. In class, you will focus your attention on designing and constructing a small, 24-36" wall hanging that incorporates vintage piecework, linens, doilies, or trim and coordinating fabrics (vintage or new). 
As soon as these events are over, we will plan our winter/spring activities. If you would like to join us in our work we would be happy to have you.



By car:

Lowell is located 28 miles north of Boston off Interstates 93 and 495 and Route 3. From Route 3 take exit 30B northbound or exit 30A southbound onto I-495 towards. Lawrence, From I-495 take exit 35C onto the Lowell Connector. Continue about 2 miles to Exit 5B onto Thomdike St.

At the 4th light, Thorndike Street merges into Dutton Street. Go to the 2nd light and turn right onto Market Street.
