

NBQA General Membership Meeting January 16, 2025 6:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m. Zoom Minutes

The Zoom meeting room was opened at 6:00 p.m. and people were welcomed and helped as needed. The meeting convened at 6:30 pm and all members were welcomed by Gail.

Gail introduced Scarlett Rose, the speaker for the evening. Scarlett explained that she began her work in 1976 and has taught in many different places, including Japan. She specializes in Celtic designs and enjoys turning scrap quilts into Friendship quilts. In addition, she enjoys using the Sashiko techniques that she has adapted using her technique of bias tape applique to create a design.

She is very active in the California Heritage Project and strongly encouraged the attendees to document each quilt whether it is an heirloom from family or one that you create. Your documentation creates the story of the quilt. She has found it fascinating to follow the story of a quilt back in time to discover the who, what, where, when and how of as many of her quilts as possible. She pointed out that in her case the story moved across different generations before arriving back with her. Blaire added that you can register your quilts on Quilt Index for free.

Throughout the presentation Scarlett showed pictures of a variety of quilts that had been created in a variety of ways. Many were hers that had been submitted for judging in different shows including the annual Houston show. Her strong message here was to be sure to "follow the rules" and be careful because quilts have been denied inclusion. Along with this, she addressed the idea that there are no "quilt police" and that many traditional ways of quilting have changed over time. She pointed out the popularity of 'cheater panels' that have become popular recently. Patterns and designs are printed on fabric and the quilter uses the panel as the foundation for a quilt stitching and embellishing as desired. This surprised many of the attendees.

Scarlett said that she likes to use Crayola Markers to add color to her cheater panels and really likes the metallic colors that are available.

Gail reported that the Quilters Gathering on December 8th was a great success and a whole lot of fun. We are looking into doing another fun sewing event here at the church and will keep you updated as we work out the particulars. The plan is that you would be able to work on something of your own choosing.

Tina Zuffoletti, Vice President: Tina explained that there is going to be a new format for the Program Committee and that there will be a Zoom link for a meeting sent out for those members who want to help with working on the program committee. The meeting will be on January 23rd at 6:30 p.m.

There will also be a Zoom invitation sent out inviting interested members to help start the process for preparing for the 2026 Golden Threads Quilt Show that NBQA will be hosting. The date and invitation will be sent out soon.

The summer theme has been determined. The challenge will be built around a panel of your choosing. The specific details will be published soon and made available.

Karen Iris, Secretary/Group Leader for Quilts of Valor: Karen spoke quickly about the Quilt of Valor presentation that occurred at the Seabee Museum and Memorial Park on December 11th. It was attended by about 30 people who came to see 6 humble and deserving veterans. Many of the QOV quilters attended and helped to drape these veterans. A short reception was held after the event in Hut 3.

Members who officially joined the Quilt of Valor Foundation last year need to renew their membership by January 31st. Sandy White has said that she will contact those who are members so that she can complete the paperwork. You should also be able to go into your account and renew on your own. Comfort Quilts, Gail Macera: Over 157 comfort quilts were donated to a variety of organizations during 2024. She has received many Thank You notes from the various groups with sincere appreciation. She is going to make the notes available to read at the March meeting.

Lynn Medeiros, Door Prizes: The door prizes are all ready to go.

Peggy Lane, Education Committee: Myrna reported for Peggy. The group provided a workshop at the Hope Center. They brought kits for the attendees to make pillows. Each person was able to complete a pillow, and extra kits were made up to use at the center. See the newsletter for pictures.
